

CSIG BOOK REVIEW GUIDELINES

Professors Maya B. Muratov (Adelphi University, mmuratov@adelphi.edu) and Ioannis Mylonopoulos (Columbia University, jm3193@columbia.edu) are the current book review editors for the CSIG. Books for review should be sent to one of the editors, but under no circumstances directly to possible reviewers. Following the example of the *Bryn Mawr Classical Review*, there will be a list of books received at the end of every issue. However, it will be the responsibility of the CSIG book review editors to contact an appropriate reviewer from among the members of the CSIG and request a respective review. Only in those rare cases where reviewers cannot be found among the members of the CSIG will the editors contact scholars who are not members of the Group.

Reviews should reach the editors within four to six months after receiving the review copy and should be sent to Prof. Maya B. Reviews should offer a very clear idea about the general structure and content of the work. Excessively specialized remarks should be avoided, unless they support points of criticism in terms of the overall methodology and the results of the monograph under review.

The final review should be sent to the editors of the CSIG Book Reviews via email no later than 6 months after the book under review has been received.

The CSIG Book Reviews will **not** publish reactions to reviews in order to avoid any form of unpleasant debate. Therefore, we urge scholars who will review works for the CSIG Book Reviews to be cautious in the ways they express negative criticism. **Factual errors** in a review will be corrected by the review editors.

Format

The review is to be written in English.

Word limit: 2000 words.

The review should be a .doc file written in Unicode. Pdf files will not be accepted –.

A full bibliographical record of the work under review is to appear at the beginning of the review.

Please make sure that the use of foreign words is in italics and remains limited to the appropriate context.

Ancient Greek terms and references to scholarly works in Modern Greek should be in Greek letters and in Unicode.

The review should have no more than 10 footnotes.

Reviewers are to sign the review with their name, institutional affiliation, and e-mail address.
